Roads:

Road Report February 11th to 17th 2019

Monday 11th. I started the day off by writing the road report from the previous week while Dale cleaned the inside of the township building. We then cleaned up the inside of the salt shed to keep the salt from the water or wetness that comes off of the backhoe tires from freezing the salt. It also helps me to estimate how much salt is there. We then washed the trucks and prepared them for the upcoming snow storm.

Tuesday 12th. The snow started at 7am and continued till 3pm. Dale and I salted and plowed all day. Overnight we received more snow and about an quarter inch of ice.

Wednesday 13th. I started at 6am and when we got all the ice cleaned up we cindered the dirt roads. The plow on the F 550 broke. The part that broke is a wear item so we went to Powell's and bought the replacement parts.

Thursday 14th. Dale and I worked on the plow and we got it all back together. It was a nice day out so we washed the trucks and plows and get them ready for the next weather event. We received a load of salt and we put it away into the salt shed.

Friday 15th. The roller was finally ready to be picked up. Northeast hydraulics rebuilt the hydraulic pump. We went and picked it up. Wayne P. came and did the backflow test. Dale and I cleaned up the garage and prepared the trucks for snow over the weekend.

Sunday 17th. Dale and I went out and plowed and salted from 8pm till 11pm.
